Commission of Colonel Thomas Dongan to be Governor of New-York.

[New-York Entries, CLI. 39.]

Whereas it hath pleased ye Kings most Excellent Matie my Soveraigne Lord & Brother by his letters Pattents to give and grant unto me and my heires and assignes All that part of ye Maine land of New England begining at a certaine place called or knowne by the name of St Croix next adjoyneing to New Scotland in America and from thence extending along ye Sea Coast unto a certaine placed called Pemaquin or Pemaquid and soe up ye River thereof to ye furthest head of ye same as it tendeth Northward and extendeth thence to ye River Kinebequi and soe upwardes to ye shortest course to ye River Canada Northward. And also all yt Island or Islands cômonly called by ye severall name or names of Matowacks or Long Island scituate lyeing and being towards ye West of Cape Codd and ye Narrow Higansetts abutting upon the Maine land betweene ye two Rivers there called or knowne by ye sevrall names of Connectecut and Hudsons river, together alsoe with ye said river called Hudsons River and all ye land from the West Side of Connectecut river to ye East side of Delaware Bay And alsoe all yse severall Islands called or knowne by the name of Martyn Vyniards and Mantukes otherwise Mantukett, 1 together with all ye lands islands soyles rivers harbours mines mineralls quarries woods marshes waters lakes fishings, hau[k]ing hunting and fowling, and all other

royaltyes and profitts comôdityes & hereditaments to ye said severall islands lands and premisses belonging & apperteyneing with their and every of their appurtences. To hold the same by my owne proper use and behoofe, wth power to correct punish pardon governe and rule ye inhabtants thereof by my selfe or such Deputyes Comissionrs or Offices as I shall thinke fitt to appoint as by his Mats said Lettrs Pattents may more fully appeare. And whereas I have since for divers good causes and consideracons by severall instrumts undr my hand and seale bargained sold released and confirmed unto Sir George Carterett (late Vice Chamberlaine to His Mats Household) and his heires, and unto Edward Billing and others and their heires, all yt tract of land (prcell of ye prmisses) comonly called or knowne by the names of East and West New Jersey, scituate on the West side of Hudsons River according to certaine Boundaryes more particularly expressed in ye sd sevrall instrumts and under certaine rents and covents as therein relacon being thereunto had may more fully appeare. And Whereas I have conceived a good opinion of the integrity prudence ability and fittness of Coll. Thomas Dongan to be employed as my Lieutent there, I have therefore thought fitt to constitute and appoint him ye said Coll: Thos2 to be my Lt and Govr within ye lands islands and places aforesaid (except the said East and West New Jersey) to performe & execute all and every the powers we's are by the said lettrs pattents granted unto me to be executed by me my Deputy Agent or Assignes To have and to hold ye said place of Lieutenant & Govr unto him the said Coll: Thomas Dongan but dureing my will and pleasure only; Hereby willing and requireing all and every the Inhabitants of the said lands Islands and places (except as before excepted) to give obedience unto him the said Coll. Thomas Dongan in all things, according to the tenour of his Mats Letters Pattents, And ye said Coll: The Dongan to observe follow and execute such Ordes and direccons as he shall from time to time receive from my selfe. Given und my hand and seale at St James's the 30th day of September 1682.
